ride in a clean, odour/smoke-free vehicle

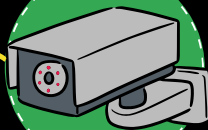
a safe ride, free from bad language, abuse, harassment, or violence

stop the ride at any time

to be charged the correct fare

request proof that camera is on

A SAFE DRIVER

doesn't ask personal questions or make sexual comments, insults, jokes

drops you off and picks you up, where requested

TAXI SAFETY IS...

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takes the safest and quickest route

charges you the fare posted on the meter, at the end of your ride
